October 12/13: At the end of this year, Pearce will celebrate five years of being "Linked with Love" with the Free Methodist church and school in Nzige. A total of seven teams, comprised of eighteen different individuals from Pearce Church and Pearce 4 Kids, have journeyed to Nzige. An eighth team, comprised of Pastor Wally and Rev. Dr. Doug Cullum, Dean of Northeastern Seminary, will leave on November 9 to provide pastoral training in Nzige for Free Methodist pastors. In addition, Bishop Samuel Kayinamura; Rwandan ICCM Director, Ephaste Niyigena; and Neddy Nanjowe, Regional Coordinator for ICCM in Burundi, DRC, Ethiopia, Malawi, and Rwanda, have each made the journey to North Chili to affirm our partnership with this Rwandan community.

Since its inception, the small preschool in Nzige has added several buildings, expanding to include primary grades. In addition, land has been purchased for a banana plantation and for grazing livestock. A playground has been added and new restroom facilities built. This year, construction began on a sanctuary to accommodate the growing ministry. Many sponsored children's lives have been significantly improved through the generosity of the families of our congregation. If you'd like to sponsor a child or learn more, stop by the table in the lobby this weekend.

Join us this weekend to celebrate this partnership and the ways in which both of our communities have been blessed. Pastor Wally will bring the message, "Planting While Traveling," and the Pearce worship team will enrich our services with music celebrating Christian community. Pastor Wally is no stranger to Pearce, having served as its Lead Pastor from 2008-2017. In his retirement from pastoral ministry, he continues to serve as an adjunct professor at Roberts Wesleyan College and Northeastern Seminary. He and his wife, Mary, celebrated 41 years of marriage this past May. The Flemings enjoy good books, traveling, and conversations over cups of coffee.

October 19/20: Dr. Tim Dwyer will be our guest preacher October 19/20 and October 26/27. Tim has been married to Paula for 36 years, and has two sons, Peter (a police detective in Atlanta), and Philip (a software engineer in Indianapolis). Both sons are married, and the Dwyers have two grandchildren. Tim was a long-time teaching pastor at Edgewood Free Methodist and has been teaching for 31 years at Anderson University, Roberts Wesleyan College, and Warner University (in Lake Wales, Fl). Children's Sabbath—October 19/20: Every year in October, congregations across Monroe County join together in a Sabbath recognition of the inestimable worth of our children. This weekend event is coordinated by The Children's Agenda's Interfaith Collaborative. People of all faith traditions agree that children deserve to be loved, respected, and have their needs met. In support of those beliefs, Children's Sabbath provides an opportunity to learn more about a significant issue that would improve the lives of children in our community, and to advocate for change. This year, the Children's Interfaith Weekend advocacy will be centered around the "Kids Can't Wait!" campaign, begun in 2018. In 2018, the Collaborative collected and delivered 2,179 letters signed by members of 52 congregations, requesting an increase in funding for Early Intervention services. In partnership with advocates from around New York State, a victory was achieved! The 2019-20 state budget included a 5% rate increase for three Early Intervention services: Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, and Speech Language Pathologists—the first rate increase in 15 years!

However, there is still much work to be done to ensure that special education and therapies are provided to young children with special needs on time, as is required under federal law. There are two programs that provide these services, depending on the child's age: Early Intervention for infants and toddlers, and Preschool Special Education for children ages 3-5. There have been improvements made in both programs in 2019 (due in part to our 2018 advocacy efforts), but too many children are still forced to wait for physical and occupational therapy, special teachers for deaf and blind children, and other critical services. Children who can access these supports early in life are more successful in school and life compared to children who wait until kindergarten.

On October 19 & 20, we'll participate in Children's Advocacy Weekend. Stop by the table in the lobby to sign a letter asking Governor Cuomo to increase payment rates to Early Intervention and Preschool Special Education professionals in the New York State 2020-21 budget, to retain providers of these services and reduce waiting lists. Our 2019 Thanksgiving Basket Ministry has begun! Mark Saturday, November 23, on your calendar and plan to help us pack and deliver boxes. Leading up to that Saturday, there are many ways to get involved and help with this ministry:

- **Copy Paper Boxes:** With all the food we collect, we need about 1,000 boxes to assemble the food for distribution. You can drop off box donations at the food collection table in the lobby or store them in the balcony of Parmerter.
- **Donate Food:** We expect to provide 1,000 families (more than 5,000 individuals) with Thanksgiving Baskets that include a turkey, fresh produce, and about 15 other food items. Food collection will continue through November 22. Donations can be separate food items or a complete "Adopt-a-box" of food items. Adopt-a-box donations are a big help and our goal is to collect 200 this year. Sign-up and get a list of items needed for Adopt-a-Box donations at the lobby collection table.
- Money for Frozen Turkeys: We hope to raise \$12,000 to purchase 1,000 frozen turkeys to go in the boxes. Place your financial donation in the offering or drop it off at the lobby reception desk during the week; checks made payable to Pearce Church, with "turkeys" on the memo line.
